Rethinking oil tank disposal

The move from oil to natural gas heating systems is building momentum. Despite lower carbon dioxide levels associated with the combustion of natural gas compared to oil, these heating system conversions raise the issue of safe redundant oil tank disposal.

As of January 2020, Northern Ireland Environment Agency (NIEA) classes redundant HDPE oil tanks as hazardous waste. The oil residue left inside the tanks contaminates the plastic and makes safe disposal and recycling difficult.

Key steps:

- 1. Decommissioning and removal
- 2. Decontamination
- 3. Safe disposal/recycling

Penalties may be faced if businesses are found not complying with NIEA disposal regulations.

The International Synergies (IS) Service can refer you to a list of NI businesses who have a registered licence with NIEA.
