This support is typically delivered through a range of channels including;

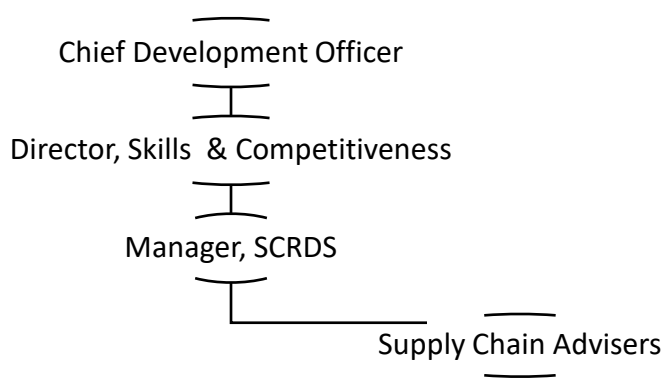
- Face to face advice and guidance

Following continued success and growth of the programme, Invest NI is now seeking to attract additional supply chain individuals on a permanent full-time basis to play a key role in the delivery of SCRDS support.

Salary

The salary range for this position is **£47,304 - £49,515 per annum (DP Grade, August 2025 Pay Scale)**. The entry point for the successful candidate will be at the minimum of the range.

Contract Type

Full-time, permanent. The successful appointee will be subject to a 9-month probationary period. At the end of this period, subject to satisfactory performance and attendance they will be confirmed in post. If their performance, conduct or attendance during this period is not satisfactory the appointment may be terminated.

This competition will also be used to create a reserve list to fill any permanent and temporary vacancies requiring the same skill set which may arise in the 12 months following the competition.

Start Date

As soon as possible (depending on notice period).

Location

The post will be based at Invest NI Headquarters in Belfast. There will be a requirement to travel within Northern Ireland to fulfil the duties of the post, and on an exceptional basis, the potential of travel in Ireland and the United Kingdom as and when required.

Main purpose of the job

Reporting to the Supply Chain Resilience and Development Solutions Manger, the Supply Chain Advisers will be key members in facilitating the delivery of Invest NI's supply chain resilience and development support service.

You will have an active role to play in assessing and supporting businesses to become more resilient, sustainable and adopt better supply chain practices to improve their overall productivity. You will engage with CEO's / MD's / Senior Leadership / Supply Chain champions and operational staff to provide effective coaching, mentoring and tailored support to embed sustainable change.

You will be expected to work collaboratively within the team to deliver against Invest NI's values and goals while also contributing to the ongoing development and enhancement of the service.

You will have the opportunity to work with businesses from various sectors who manage a supply chain as part of their business or who are involved in the extended supply chain and meet the programme eligibility requirements.

Key Responsibilities:

Working with staff at all levels in companies you will facilitate the embedding of supply chain improvement techniques, support the creation of a supply chain improvement culture and build capability. This will include supporting the delivery of the SCRDS programme objectives, planning and executing projects effectively through:

- Assessing and identifying opportunities for improvements in the supply chain for Northern Ireland companies within a manufacturing or tradeable services environment and to promote greater efficiency in the supply chain.

- Conducting in company diagnostics, supporting the development of supply chain improvement deployment plans and facilitating their execution ultimately linked to the business strategy and results.
- Coaching and mentoring company leaders, individuals and teams in the application and effective deployment of supply chain improvements and techniques to deliver sustainable benefits.
- Supporting the development and delivery of supply chain training modules and materials as required, including bespoke training sessions to support in-company teams to up-skill and build supply chain capability of company team members to address improvement opportunities.
- Monitoring training and supply chain improvement activities to ensure identified improvements and benefits are achieved in support of the SCRDS programme objectives.
- Supporting businesses to assess supply chain skills/ potential resource gaps. Acting as project owner, assessing and processing business case applications through casework for approval for potential financial assistance of new dedicated key worker.
- Supporting opportunities for companies to reshore / nearshore elements of their supply chain in N. Ireland.
- Collaborating with wider colleagues and internal/external stakeholders to deliver enhanced supply chain services including support and guidance for FDI opportunities and promotion of supply chain development of NI businesses

This list is not exhaustive, and the successful applicant will be required to perform additional duties as allocated by management.

Selection Process

i) Selection Criteria

To be considered for the role, applicants must be able to demonstrate, by the closing date for applications, how they meet the following essential criteria, **using specific examples**.

ii) Shortlisting

A shortlist of candidates for assessment and interview will be prepared on the basis of the information contained in the application form.

Responses in your application form should refer to specific examples that demonstrate how and to what extent you satisfy the essential criteria outlined. Only those applicants who, from the information supplied on the application form, most closely match the selection criteria for the post will be shortlisted.

Application forms which do not provide the necessary detailed information in relation to the knowledge, skills and criterion required will be rejected.

iii) Interview and Assessment

Shortlisted candidates will be invited to the next stage of the selection process which will include an interview and assessment, scheduled to be held in late June/early July.

The selection panel will assess applicants against the interview and assessment criteria as appropriate. The panel's decision at every stage of the selection process is final.

iv) Application Forms

Completed applications, demonstrating the experience and skills sought, must be submitted to the Monitoring Officer by the specified closing date.

All applications for employment are considered strictly on the basis of merit.

To ensure equality of opportunity for all applicants:

- Only completed applications on the application form will be accepted. CVs or any other supplementary material in addition to completed application forms will not be accepted.
- Applicants must complete the application form in Arial size 10 font, or block capitals using black ink.
- The space available on the application form is the same for all applicants and must not be altered or re-formatted and applicants must not exceed the space provided.
- Applicants submitting their completed application form electronically must ensure that it is sent via email as an attachment (either as a PDF or Microsoft Word document only). Forms sent via any other online method or converted into any other digital format, or which Invest NI deems unsafe to open, will not be accepted.

- Applications which are received after the closing date and time will not be accepted.
- Applicants should ensure they provide evidence of their experience on their application form, giving length of experience, examples and dates as required.

It is vital that you highlight your specific role and contribution by using actual examples to illustrate your experience against the selection criteria.

- **Before Starting**

Prior to taking up your duties, you will be asked to accept the main terms of your appointment in writing.

- **Eligibility to Work in the UK**

All applicants must be legally able to work and reside in the country of the vacancy with the correct visa/work permit status or demonstrate eligibility to obtain the relevant permit. Any costs related to obtaining or renewing permits and visas are the responsibility of the successful applicant.

Your appointment is also subject to a background check. Invest NI will organise a Criminal Record Check on successful candidates to be carried out by AccessNI. The category of AccessNI check required for this post is Basic Disclosure Certificate. You should not put off applying for a post because you have a conviction, and any disclosure will be seen in the context of the job role, the nature of the offence and the responsibility for the care of existing clients and employees. At management discretion and without adversely affecting the overall efficiency of Invest NI, staff who have built up enough hours each month can take up to a maximum of 3 flexible working days. –
